Doug and Wanda Mann were both involved in agriculture in their youth. Doug was born December 30. 1959 and raised in Melville. Saskatchewan. He was involved in 4-H dairy projects growing up. Wanda was born on May 5, 1960 and grew up in Ottawa and Victoria, as her father, John, was a naval officer. Upon her father's retirement, her family returned to Swift Current, Saskatchewan where her father originated. John was a Hereford breeder and served as the first barn boss at Canadian Western Agribition. Wanda owned some Herefords through her youth, which she sold to pay for her post secondary schooling. Both Doug and Wanda graduated high school in 1977 and moved to Saskatoon where they met and attended the University of Saskatchewan College of Veterinary Medicine. They graduated with doctorates in the spring of 1984 and got married the same year on June 9. Both Doug and Wanda set up veterinary practices near Swift Current. In 1987, they bought some Herefords and started Phantom Creek Livestock. In 1988, they had their first son, Cody, who is an RCMP officer with a rank of Sergeant. Cody married Joanne, and they have two girls, Spencer and Hazel. Doug and Wanda had their second son Calvin in 1991, who passed away at 3 ½ months of age. Doug and Wanda enjoy hiking, fishing, golf, travel and horses. Wanda is actively competing in the Western Dressage Association, competing in Canada and the USA. At present, in her division, Wanda is ranked first in Canadian Gated Dressage.
